Buses

Pre-Kinder

Pre-Kinder sessions are also offered in Terms 3 and 4 for all children who are turning 5 years of age the following year and will be attending Kinder. Parents are required to stay on-site for Pre-Kinder sessions.

These sessions are a valuable time for children to interact with each other and become familiar, happy and confident within the school environment.

Emergency Contacts

It is important that we have emergency contact people for all students enrolled. Contacts must have a telephone and be able to transport students home. Please advise the people on your list that you have named them as a contact. It is important that these details are kept up to date.

First Aid

If a student has a substantial injury that will not affect their participation at school, parents will be notified of the injury. If a student has a hard knock to the head or a more severe injury, parents will be contacted. Severe injuries will be cause for staff to call an ambulance with parents notified immediately. We



generally encourage students to stay at school and show rescillience when they have sustained a minor injury and parents are not generally notified throughout the school day where minor first aid has been applied. We have multiple trained First Aid officers who hold current certiffication.

Fundraising

Families will be advised of fundraising activities throughout the year as well as information on how the funds were utilised to support our students and school.

We sincerely value the hard work done by our School Association.

Infectious Diseases

Headlice, school sores, scabies, conjunctivitis, measles, chicken pox and COVID 19 are contagious. Staff, students and parents need to exclude themselves from the school during the transmissible period if they are infected. Students who have live headlice will need to be sent home from school and can return once they have been treated and all live headlice have been removed. Your co-operation is greatly appreciated.

Levies

Sassafras Primary School charge a composite levy for each enrolled student in accordance with the DECYP Policy. The school levy for 2024 is Kinder - \$120, Prep – Grade 2 - \$140 and Grade 3-6 - \$170. Levies assists the school with costs of student stationery, classroom requisites, library books, subject materials, sports equipment, excursion costs, swimming and water safety programs, and other general everyday student support resources. It also covers the provision of a student Book Pack at the beginning of each new school year. Levies do not cover the cost of overnight excursions, out of school hours activities, local sporting organisation registrations or school uniform. Some families may be eligible for student financial assistance (STAS) to support with the payment of levies. Payment plans are offered to those who may require assistance and who are not eligible for STAS. Please contact our office for more information.

Medical Conditions and Medication

There are DECYP guidelines and policies in place in relation to administration of medication to students. If your child requires medication (short or long-term) to be taken during school hours, parents/carers are asked to bring the medication in with them in its original container. Medication cannot be administered by school staff until an authorisation form has been completed by an authorised person. Forms are available from the school office.

Physical Education

Daily Fitness Program

This K-6 program is held daily and is in addition to our weekly physical education class every Thursday. Children should wear appropriate footwear for exercise every day.



Out of School Sports

Our students participate in a wide range of sports jointly with other primary schools. Sporting clinics and local sports are available and information from individual clubs is advertised through our newsletter.



Swimming and Water Safety Program

The school participates in the DECYP mandatory Swimming and Water Safety program for all students in Grades 3 to 5. There is also a school-based program for Prep - Grade 6 students. These programs are part of the curriculum, and the costs are included in levies



School Association Committee

We have an active School Association Committee consisting of representatives of parents, staff and community members who meet at least once per term. We value and appreciate your feedback and input, 'Working Together Today for Tomorrow', making SPS the best that it can be. Members are elected by both parents and staff.

Sun Protection

Children should wear sunscreen wherever possible and we ask that parents either apply sunscreen to their children prior to arriving at



school and/or sunscreen is available in classrooms for daily use. All students are required to wear a school hat outside in **Terms 1 and 4.**

Our school is an accredited Sun Smart School.

Specialist Programs

All classes from Kinder to Grade 6 participate in specialist programs such as STEM, Japanese, Music, Physical Education and Library each week.

Special Interest Groups

Children are offered a diverse range of special interest group activities aimed at fostering creativity, skill development, and student and community engagement. We undertake activities such as leadership workshops, coding classes, culinary adventures in cooking, artistic expression, engaging board games and puzzles, exploration of sustainability practices, and the joy of gardening.







Student Support

School Nurse

School Health Nurses support schools to create a physical and social environment that promotes health and wellbeing and assists to improve the health and education outcomes for children and young people in Tasmania. The School Health Nurse focus in Primary Schools include:

- Vision and Hearing checks
- Health Assessments
- Providing advice and information to students, parents and school staff on children's health, physical activity and nutrition
- Local, state and national health and promotion initiatives
- Health education aligned with the Australian Curriculum including healthy relationships, body esteem, resilience and mental wellbeing and drugs and alcohol
- Assisting schools with the management of complex medical conditions
- Addressing any medical issues that may be impacting learning

School Psychologist

When teachers or parents have concerns about children and their learning, referrals to the School Psychologist may be considered. Written parental consent is required for referrals. Following assessments, the psychologist will arrange to meet with parents/teachers to discuss the results.

Social Worker

A school Social Worker is available to assist families and students experiencing a wide range of issues affecting their wellbeing and experiences at school as well as providing a link between home and school. Following assessments, the Social Worker will arrange to meet with parents prior to working with their children.

Speech and Language Pathologist

A Speech and Language Pathologist is available to assess, diagnose and provide treatment to students with a wide range of communication difficulties. Written parental consent is required for referrals.

Volunteers

It is a DECYP mandatory requirement that all parent help, volunteers and employees have a current and valid Registration to Work with Vulnerable People card. If you require any further information please contact the school office or go to the Department of Justice website:

It is also a requirement to complete Safeguarding training before you start working with children or young people this year. This is to understand what to do if you believe a child or young person is being harmed and to make sure you are doing all you can to prevent this from



happening. This video training will take around 12 minutes to complete and a copy of your completion certificate emailed to you will need to be shown at the school office when signing in. Scan the QR code to complete your training.

Uniform

Students are expected to wear full school uniform. A uniform list is available from the school office. Make-up, high-heeled shoes, thongs and "open-toed" shoes/sandals are not appropriate for children to wear to school. Labelling of clothing is important, especially jackets which are often taken off for PE. We realise that children's clothes are expensive and labels help us to return lost items. Note: A lost property tub is kept near the office for any items found. Please contact the school office for more information if required.

We also have second-hand clothing for sale at the office.
