School Levies

The West Launceston Primary School Dress Code requires **Kindergarten** students to wear items detailed in the **WLPS Everyday or Sport Uniform**s.

Please note: As active learning is part of daily programming; it is not required that students have a separate PE uniform. Our emphasis is on children being neat but comfortable and ready for all challenges.

The following requirements apply in relation to the **Dress Code**:

- Jewellery: students are not encouraged to wear jewellery with the exception of sleeper or stud earrings
- Make-up: students are encouraged not to wear make-up
- Footwear: as per the Uniform Policy students should wear fully enclosed shoes
- Personal presentation/appearance including non-school uniform items (i.e. hoodies, clothing should not display inappropriate or offensive logos, images or slogans).

New and second-hand uniforms are available through the school uniform shop. This is staffed by parent volunteers and opens on a rostered basis. Check with our office staff as to the day and times that the uniform shop will be open.

Orders for uniform items may be placed and paid for via the Qkr App. Items may be collected from the main office or sent to the student's classroom.

You can also pay with cash or visa card. All credit card transactions will incur a 1.95% fee.

General Information

After School Care (and Vacation Care)

Bus Services

Our school has metro bus services for Summerdale/Prospect areas, Blackstone Heights and the city. Bus students are supervised after school by a member of the teaching staff.

Canteen

A school canteen operates and provides healthy recess and lunch options to students at reasonable prices. It is available for recess and lunch purchases on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

The Qkr App is the method for ordering recess and lunch. You can download the App; search for West Launceston Primary School and order your lunch through this method. You can also ask our friendly staff in the office for further information.

School Newsletter

Our school newsletter is uploaded each Wednesday morning. It is most readily available via our WLPS SZapp, which is available for download on Apple and Android phones. A link to the newsletter is published on our Facebook page.

School App - SZapp

The WLPS School App is available for Apple and Android phones. When you download the free App:

- You can notify us of your child's absence through the App.

We also have a Facebook page which is utilised to remind parents of upcoming events, and to share news about key events for the school.

Fruit Break and Eating at School

Some classes have a scheduled 'Fruit Break' in the morning block where children are encouraged to eat a piece of fruit from their lunch box as a way of promoting health and wellbeing.

For lunch, children need to bring something which can be eaten cold, as we do not have the facilities to heat food.

Parent Help and Volunteering

Parents are actively encouraged to be part of the school community. We value parents' involvement and engagement in their child's education. There are numerous opportunities for engagement and involvement.

All visitors, parent help and volunteers need to sign in at the main office on our Kiosk System.

Please note that all parent helpers and volunteers must hold a **Registration to Work with Vulnerable People** to work with children in any Department of Education school within Tasmania. **This is a legal requirement.** Unfortunately, we are unable to allow any adult to volunteer in the school unless they have a card. Please go to <u>https://cbos.tas.gov.au/topics/licensing-and-</u> <u>registration/registrations/work-with-vulnerable-people</u> to submit an application. The approximate cost is \$20 and is valid for a 3 year period.

*With Covid-19, safe practices are a priority and any parent helpers and volunteers are required to check in using the Check in Tas App while they are at school.

Student Assistance Scheme

The Education Department provides assistance for families on low income or benefit payments. Parents who have a current concession card as listed below can apply for dependent students for assistance under the STAS:

Please note if you are already receiving student assistance you do not need to complete a form. For 2022 a new on-line form has been developed to assist with processing applications for new applicants.

Once a validated form is completed the Department of Education will confirm the outcome of your application in writing, this process takes approximately 14 days.

Swimming & Water Safety Program

All students in Grades 3, 4 and 5 participate in the Swimming and Water Safety Program during the year for a fortnight. Payment for this program is covered by school levies. Students who receive Student Assistance do not pay this cost. At risk Grade 6 students are also included in the program.

Early Years (Birth to 5 years)

At West Launceston the Early Years (birth to five years) are a priority. Building strong partnerships with families in our community ensure a positive beginning for children in life, school and education. Held in our state of the art Early Learning Centre, the Early Years programs have a significant impact on the development of positive partnerships with parent/guardians as well as supporting parents to engage in their child's learning.

We offer a range of Early Learning Programs. Our emphasis is on supporting families as their child's first teachers. **Parent-Child** (0 - 4 years) and **Flying Fours** (pre-Kindergarten children) sessions are facilitated by members of our Early Childhood teaching team. This provides continuity for children as they are supported in their learning from birth to Kindergarten and beyond.

Kindergarten

Children who are aged four by 31 December in any given year are eligible to attend Kindergarten in Tasmanian schools the following year. Children turn five years old during the Kindergarten year. Children attend Kindergarten for 3 full days (15 hours) each week. At West Launceston Primary School our students are onsite for 18 hours each week.

Our Kindergarten staff members are highly experienced. They provide a focused program which caters for children's individual needs. The emphasis is on enabling children to develop independence and skills to prepare them for being at school full time in Prep.

Flying Fours Sessions (Pre-Kindergarten Term 4)

Flying Fours runs for 60 minutes per week and caters for children who will be enrolling at West Launceston Primary School the following year for Kindergarten.

Flying Fours aims to prepare children with the skills that will allow for a successful transition to Kindergarten. Through regular attendance children become familiar with the school environment and staff members. They develop self-confidence and become used to spending time in a group with school staff.

Children are provided with opportunities to practise the following skills: following instructions, sitting for short periods in a group for a story/songs, sharing with classmates, using words to solve problems or disagreements and, building connections and developing relationships with other children.

An important part of the Flying Fours program is the development of early literacy, numeracy, fine motor and visual art skills through play.

Parent-Child Playgroup

Parent-Child Playgroup provides an opportunity for children (0 to 4 years) to:

- ✓ Develop and increase their social skills through new experiences
- ✓ Learn sharing, co-operation and simple routines
- ✓ Interact with other adults and children in a safe environment
- ✓ Enjoy learning more about their worlds.

Of equal importance is the opportunity for parents and carers to:

- ✓ Meet other local families and develop new friendships
- ✓ Relax and talk in a friendly environment
- ✓ Share experiences and ideas
- ✓ Play with children and nurture a spirit of cooperation.

To assist parents in their important role of supporting children's early learning, children attending Parent-Child Playgroup are able to borrow from a range of picture books and exciting nursery rhyme packs.

During the year we also provide opportunities for parents at Parent-Child sessions to interact with other community professionals from a range of support services.

Student Leadership

Our school has an active Student Leadership Group whose members have been elected by their peers. The members of this group have a range of school based responsibilities and represent our school at community events. Additional leadership opportunities include sports and Daily PE leaders and buddy mentors.

Transition

We strive to make transition as seamless and smooth as possible, both within our school and beyond. Early Childhood and Primary teachers take seriously their responsibility to understand the needs of everyone in their classes. They create time to share information as children move through their schooling years. Transition programs with Prospect High School and Riverside High School support and prepare our Grade 6 students for Grade 7. Upper primary students are involved in programs and activities throughout the year. Teachers from both schools meet and share understandings to support the transition process.

Respectful Schools/Respectful Behaviour

This aspect of our work is core to the school's successful function as we support children to develop appropriate personal and social skills to successfully navigate school and for successful future citizenship.

Students are encouraged to be positive players in the yard and demonstrate our school value of respect to others through being inclusive, caring, patient and friendly towards others. Students are also encouraged and supported by staff to respect the school environment.

The School Curriculum

Staff at West Launceston Primary provide comprehensive delivery of the Australian Curriculum for students from Prep to Grade 6. The Kindergarten and Early Years teachers use the Early Years Framework. In the pursuit of excellence, our curriculum offers a range of learning opportunities designed to develop students' skills, knowledge and personal attributes to enable them to become successful life-long learners. In particular, we seek to develop skills and attributes that will be critical for success in the future.

Our students have the opportunity to learn and achieve the highest outcomes in a personalised learning program. Learning includes academic, social, emotional and behavioural aspects. Learning may look different for some children in one or more of these areas based on their individualised needs and personal learning program. We provide adjustments and flexible learning opportunities to both support **and** enrich/extend learning for individuals.

Literacy - English

Our school offers a high quality Literacy Program from Kinder to Grade 6. The development of students' skills in Reading and Viewing, Writing and Speaking and Listening are developed in dedicated daily literacy teaching and learning blocks in each class. Literacy Intervention is provided to support student learning and is based on an identified need.

Numeracy - Mathematics

The core strands of the mathematics curriculum are *Number & Algebra, Measurement & Geometry and Statistics & Probability.* The proficiency strands are *understanding, fluency, problem solving and reasoning.*

We focus on big ideas and concepts in Mathematics. Mathematics learning incorporates key outcomes from the Australian Curriculum and engages students in the processes of thinking and working mathematically.

Science

Developing scientific literacy skills of all students is central to the Science Curriculum so that they are able to make informed decisions about the role of science and technology in shaping their lives, the direction of society and the future of the world. The three strands are *Science Understanding, Science as a Human Endeavour and Inquiry Skills.*

Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS)

This learning area draws together the distinct but related Australian Curriculum subjects of History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship (3-6), and Economics and Business (5-6). Key ideas explored in HASS are: who we are and who came before us; the ways in which people, places, ideas and events are perceived and connected; how societies and economies operate; and, how people exercise responsibilities and participate in society as informed decision makers.

Health and Physical Education

Students have weekly lessons in Physical Education. This program supports skills development in areas such as loco motor, gymnastics, ball use, dance, striking and kicking. A daily fitness program is also a key daily activity as we encourage the development of healthy lifestyle choices.

The Arts

At WLPS students are encouraged and afforded opportunities to develop their creative capabilities through The Arts. Core strands in the Arts are Dance, Drama, Media, Music and Visual Art.

Visual arts experiences in a variety of different mediums and materials are offered as part of all class programs. Flexible programs provide supplementary visual arts experiences.

Students have weekly Arts lessons with a specialist teacher with a different focus each term. The school also has a Choir.

The Esk Band Program is available to students in Grades 3 to 6 (for which there is a cost to parents) who desire to learn an instrument.

Digital Technologies

DT is one of our specialist lessons at WLPS. In DT, students use computational thinking and information systems to define, design and implement digital solutions.

Students use ICT to access information, generate and test ideas and to reflect, inquire and communicate their understanding with others.

To remain Cyber Safe, students from Grades 3 to 6 and their parents, must have signed an *Acceptable Use Agreement* before they are allowed to access the Internet at school. Students who break this agreement may have their Internet privileges withdrawn.

It is permissible for students in Grades 5 and 6 to bring along Personal Devices (such as iPads, iPods and tablets), provided that the device does not have its own Internet access, such as 3G, and that

students and parents have signed the *Acceptable Use Agreement* which will be given out to students at the start of the year. The school, however, will not take responsibility for damage to or theft of personal devices.

Physical Education and Sport

The school encourages participation in a range of sporting activities. All students participate in weekly PE lessons.

The school holds athletic, cross country and swimming carnivals through the year. Selected athletes from Grades 3-6 represent the school at the Launceston State Schools Sporting Association Carnivals where they compete with students from other schools in the Launceston area. Further opportunities for talented athletes are the All Schools Cross Country and State Athletics Carnivals.

Grades 5 and 6 students compete in summer and winter sports rosters with other schools in the Launceston area.

Reporting to Parents

In 2022 a new model of reporting to parents s being phased in. Details of this are still being finalised.

Enrolment Enquiries

In accordance with the *Education Act 2016* West Launceston Primary School is only able to take enrolments for families in area.

Our administrative staff members, Jodi Clark, Allison Donnelly, Debbie Spinks and Megan Grainger are always available to answer your queries and will send out information about the school and enrolment forms on request.
