LEVIES

GENERAL INFORMATION

ABSENCES

Under the *Education Act 2016* parents/guardians are required to ensure that children attend school every day unless there are genuine reasons for absences, such as illness. Parents and carers are required to always talk to the school about why their child is going to be absent from school. When a student is absent for any reason the school should be contacted by telephone or note explaining the circumstances. The school has a free app where absences can be recorded. Students should not be taken from the school without first contacting the office and signing the 'Student Sign Out' book located at the office. You will then receive a slip to provide to the teacher when collecting your child from the classroom.

ALLERGIES

Food allergy is a growing public health issue that impacts almost every school across Tasmania. Studies indicate that school-age children who have food allergies can have a reaction at school.

Schools must develop adequate plans to manage food allergies appropriately, including information on handling medical emergencies and taking preventative measures to avoid a student's exposure to a known food allergen.

To manage life threatening allergies we must ensure that children don't share food, educate staff, parents and children with regard to the specific allergy and ensure staff are trained to manage the allergy. There may be times throughout your child's schooling they will be asked to refrain from bringing certain foods to school to ensure the safety of everyone.

ASSEMBLIES

School assemblies are held fortnightly. Parents and friends are welcome at these assemblies where children's learning is celebrated and examples of educational excellence shared. Please note: there may be restrictions due to Covid in 2021

BIKES, SCOOTERS AND SKATEBOARDS

Bikes, scooters and skateboards are not to be ridden in the school grounds. Students are able to ride bikes to school and park them in bike racks. Students should wear helmets.



BOOK CLUB

Our school operates the Scholastic Book Club. Each month order forms are sent home with your child. Orders are made online at scholastic.com.au/LOOP or via Scholastic Book Club Loop, downloaded from the App Store or Google Play.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast Club operates between 8.30 and 8.55am. Students are to enter by the door to the Grade 6 Open Plan area. Students are provided with fruit, cereal and toast.

BUSES

Currently there is a Metro bus service to the Rocherlea area and a Rexys bus to Hillwood, Swan Bay, Windemere, Dilston. See Office for details. Students catching the bus after school are supervised by a duty teacher.

CANTEEN

The Canteen operates at recess and lunch times from Monday to Friday. Children order their lunch via the Qkr app. Download free from Google Play or the Playstore.



The menu is published on the school app, Qkr, or available from the office.

COMPUTERS

Technology is an integral part of the school program. The school is linked to the Internet. All students have access to multi-media computers in classrooms and the computer lab. Students are required to sign a user agreement form at the beginning of the school year.



ENTRY TO SCHOOL

Students should enter the school via the external gates. Entry to the foyer is only available when accompanied by a parent or when arriving late after the gates are locked. For the safety of our students gates are locked at 9.00am and unlocked at 2.45pm.

FOOD AND DRINK

We are a 'Move Well Eat Well' school which means we are committed to:

Tapping into Water Everyday – and limit sweet drinks - aims to increase water consumption and reduce the consumption of sweet drinks. Drinking water instead of sweet drinks provides hydration for concentration and learning and promotes healthy teeth.

Planting Fruit and Veg in Your Lunchbox – aims to increase consumption of fruit and vegetables. Fruit and vegetables provide essential nutrients for healthy eyes, skin and hair and protect against many diseases. Classroom have a fruit break at 10.00am where children are able to eat fresh fruit and vegetables. This is not a time for other snacks.

Limiting 'Sometimes' Foods is about reducing foods and drinks like chocolate, confectionary, sweet drinks, crisps, chips, fried foods and some cakes, biscuits and pastry items that are high in fat, sugar or salt. Less 'sometimes' foods means children fill up on nutritious foods and drinks required for growth and lifelong health.

East Tamar Primary School is making a genuine attempt to be a **Nut Aware and Egg Aware** school in response to the serious allergic reactions some of our students may experience when they come into contact with either of these products. We ask for your support in not sending food to school that contain nuts/nut products or egg/egg products.

HATS

We are a 'Sunsmart' School. Students are encouraged to wear broad brimmed or legionnaires hats when outdoors. Positive modelling by parents/guardians and teachers is appreciated. Hats can be purchased at the office. Students are required to wear a hat outside in Terms I until Easter and Term 4.

LAUNCHING INTO LEARNING SESSIONS

East Tamar Primary offers a number of sessions for parents with children who are under school age. This is a valuable time for parents and students to learn together. Parents are required to stay and participate in their child's learning through play during all Launching into Learning sessions. All sessions will begin early in the year. Times and details will be advertised in the newsletter, on the school app or the playgroup Facebook page.

Pre-Kinder

Pre-Kinder sessions are for students turning 4 years in 2020. Pre Kinder prepares children for kindergarten by helping them to establish friendships and by learning how to work individually and in groups. Enrolment forms are available from the office. Please bring a water bottle and a piece of fruit to share.

Parent/Child Playgroup

Playgroups are beneficial for children, families and communities.

Play provides all children with the opportunity to learn, experience, investigate and interact with the environment. During play children create meaning from the world around them. It offers the child experiences to think, plan, create, do and find out.

Playgroup empowers parents and encourages them to recognize the role they play in their child's development. Playgroup allows parents to take time out of a busy life, to

slow down and enjoy playing with their child, to watch and delight in the amazing steps their child takes while making sense of the world around them.

Playgroup sessions are provided for parents and their children from birth to 4 years. The expectation is that you will work alongside your child at this time. Please bring a water bottle and a piece of fruit to share.

Gross Motor Group

Gross motor skills are those which require whole body movement involving the large muscles of the body to perform everyday functions, such as standing and walking, running and jumping, and sitting upright a the table. They also include eye-hand coordination skills such as ball throwing, catching, kicking, as well as riding a bike or a scoter and swimming. During these sessions students are provided with opportunities to develop these important skills.

Out and About

Out and About offers excursions into the wider community. Times and details of the excursions will be advertised in the newsletter, on the school app or the playgroup Facebook page.

LIBRARY

Students are encouraged to borrow books from the library on a regular basis during their library lesson time. If a book is lost or damaged an account may be sent to the parents/guardians for the replacement cost of the book. Students must have a book bag in order to borrow. These are available for purchase from the school office.



LOST PROPERTY

Lost property will be placed in the Lost Property Basket in the corridor opposite the office. We recommend that you clearly name all items of clothing.

NEWSLETTER

The school newsletter is distributed to the eldest child in the family every second Wednesday. The newsletter includes details of school activities and notices of a general nature.

NO SMOKING

The whole school is a "Smoke Free Zone", i.e. no smoking at all within the buildings or grounds.



PARENT HELP

Parent help is encouraged throughout the school. Classroom teachers will organise this depending on their individual needs. Please contact your child's teacher if you would like to assist. A Working With Vulnerable People Check is required. Details

REPORTING TO PARENTS

Parents are encouraged to take an active interest in their child/children's education and are welcome to visit the school to discuss their progress or any problems or delights at a mutually convenient time. Formal parent/teacher discussions are organised at the end of Term 2 and written reports are sent home three times a year.

SUPPORT SERVICES

A Social Worker, School Psychologist, Speech Pathologist and School Nurse visit the school. If you need to see them please contact the office or your child's class teacher.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL

We have a Student Representative Council (S.R.C.) who are elected by the students. The representatives liaise between the students and the teachers.


